collectors, Dorianna and Cameron are happy;


Aurora's their home; Dori didn't far roam, to make Cameron all sweet and sappy.

QE Diamond Jubilee medal for Pat Forbes

Patricia Forbes was recently presented with the Queen Elizabeth Diamond Jubilee Medal for her many years of service to the Lasqueti Community.

From her arrival on Lasqueti Island in the 1940s to teach at the old Maple Grove School, to today where she still represents Lasqueti Island on the French Creek Harbour Authority, the ferry committee and the ramp commitee, Forbes has been a powerful contributor to the community.

"I first started working with Mrs. Forbes in the early 1970s when the newly formed Island Trust requested volunteers to form an Advisory Planning Commission to advise the Trustees," said Lasqueti resident Merrick Anderson.

"She served as secretary to my chairmanship for the next 15 years or so, and minutes from the meetings were always accurate and in my mailbox the next day."

"No matter how much time she devoted to the community, she also served her family, and serves on the board of directors of the family business, The Lasqueti Fish Co.

Despite all this, she still managed to gift the new babies born on Lasqueti with hand-knit booties, plus many other community building activities."

"It gave me great pleasure in my role as regional director to be able to facilitate a tangible way to honour Mrs. Forbes life time of community service."

Why He's Joined the Environmental Movement...




Danielle started her 1st year at Crofton house, grade 6 and is playing soccer, field hockey, drama/choir and writing for the "Crofton Chronicles".

Through the bush and over the hills I headed, the 4 and a half km to where it needed to go. It was a grueling trek. Everything in my body ached. My legs burned, my feet numb, but I kept on going.

I was about 100 yards from the end of the fire hose line when I heard the helicopter circling above. I stopped just shy of the end of the line to catch my breath when all the sudden the chopper swooped down and hovered above an opening in the forest canopy.

I watched from below as a door slid open and about 15 boxes of hose were thrown out to the ground

below, as well as 6 boxes of water and two flats of Gatorade. I almost cried right then and there as I realized I had dragged all that gear through the forest for nothing as we had more than enough hose for the rest of the fire! It did make things better that later that night we had pizza delivered to us on the fire line - in the same manner - thrown out the window of a helicopter. First class pizza delivery!"


Still working, no big lottery win and 4 kids still on the payroll!!?




